REP. SHARON SHEWMAKE ANNOUNCES HER CAMPAIGN FOR WASHINGTON STATE SENATE IN THE 42ND DISTRICT

Bellingham, WA -- Today Representative Sharon Shewmake announced that she is running to represent Whatcom County's 42nd Legislative District in the Washington State Senate. As the only economist in the Legislature she will continue to work hard for the people of Whatcom County. She's known for a pragmatic, bipartisan approach to solving problems. She shows up to meetings with a spreadsheet to make sure the numbers add up, and that decisions are based on facts and science, not ideology.
